

## **Links to Social and Economic information (outside the UK-EOF remit)**

The UK-EOF held an expert workshop in September 2010 to identify the Social and Economic information needed to address key environmental issues and vice versa (the need for environmental information to address social or economic issues).

During the workshop, delegates mapped socio-economic themes to the UK-EOF (environmental) headline issues and from this, identified social and economic datasets that may assist in the answering of key environmental questions.

Metadata for datasets that have a direct environmental component are being gathered and will be added to the UK-EOF Observation Activity Catalogue [www.ukeof.org.uk](http://www.ukeof.org.uk). Links to other datasets, which are outside of the UK-EOF remit but may provide supporting or additional evidence when addressing key questions and issues, are listed below.

### **Major Data Sources**

The main sources of a range of social, economic and environmental data/information include:

- UK Data Archive (<http://www.data-archive.ac.uk/>) hosted by the ESDS (see next entry) is a collection of social, economic and humanities data.
- Economic and Social Data Service (<http://www.esds.ac.uk/>) is a national data service providing access and support for an extensive range of key economic and social data.
- National Online Statistics – data on the economy, environment, health, labour market, population, society, travel and tourism and Census information (<http://www.ons.gov.uk/about/index.html>)

Linked to the ONS are two further information hubs:

- ONS Publication Hub (<http://www.statistics.gov.uk/hub/index.html>) a searchable knowledge discovery tool for those looking for the latest statistics from UK government departments and first releases of National Statistics – data holdings range from Agriculture to Construction, price of materials, Employment, Crime or Travel and Transport.
- Data for Neighbourhoods and Regeneration (<http://www.data4nr.net/introduction/>) – for the identification and signposting of datasets available for targeting, monitoring, priority setting and performance management at a neighbourhood level.
