The Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs (Defra) supports specific projects to develop the NBN further. The NBN Gateway is the tool developed by the NBN Trust and its partners for communicating and sharing biodiversity data via the internet. In January 2013 there were over 80 million species records from over 140 data providers available through the Gateway. The Gateway also gives access to geographic information (e.g. designated site boundaries) and habitat data. The NBN had its 10 year anniversary in 2010 and published a strategy for its development over the next 10 years.
