Page 2: Background information - What is the UKEOF and what does it do?

UKEOF is a partnership of <u>17 public sector organisations</u> with an interest in using and providing evidence from environmental observations.

Mission: to work collaboratively to maximise the value of the UK's environmental observations.

Aims: to achieve effective partnership working in environmental observations, and to maximise the benefits of observations to the UK including for science, policy and economic growth.

Current major activities include:

- **Management Group:** governance body consisting of UKEOF partner organisations, agrees UKEOF objectives and work programme, discusses and escalates UK strategic level monitoring and observation issues.
- **Citizen Science Working Group:** meets 4x per year, recent outputs include <u>reports</u>, and a <u>tool</u> to help organisations considering using citizen science for monitoring, a subgroup is organising a workshop in January 2018 on overcoming barriers to the use of citizen science.
- Data Advisory Group & UKEOF catalogue: group meets 4x per year, key knowledge exchange topics: open data, new technological developments and implementation of the INSPIRE Directive, recent outputs include a Big Data Advice note. <u>The UKEOF</u> <u>catalogue</u> is the only list of UK monitoring and observation activities and meets INSPIRE requirements.
- **Natural Capital** workshop and working group: workshop held April 2017, <u>report here</u> identifies 10 prioritised actions to coordinate environmental monitoring for UK Natural Capital reporting, a working group is being established to address these actions.
- Freshwater Monitoring Strategies workshop: November 2017, for monitoring agencies across the UK to compare new strategic approaches and identify shared interests.
- **Monitoring & Modelling** workshop: February 2018, to bring together modelling & monitoring communities to explore the role of modelling in designing monitoring programmes.

Governance and Delivery Model: Partnership activities are agreed by the Management Group and included in the Workplan. Delivery of the Workplan is supported by a small secretariat team hosted by the Centre for Ecology & Hydrology (CEH), every activity has a champion from a UKEOF partner organisation. The secretariat includes a communications lead and leads for Wales and Scotland.

Funding Model and Membership: Nine of the 17 partners make a financial contribution, the major funders are Defra and NERC. Each partner signs a Co-Funding Agreement annually.

2013 review finding: The last review of UKEOF in 2013 found that "UK-EOF's main strength is in bringing the whole community together to enable networking and sharing of intelligence in a neutral space and hence to discourage unilateral decisions on observations."
